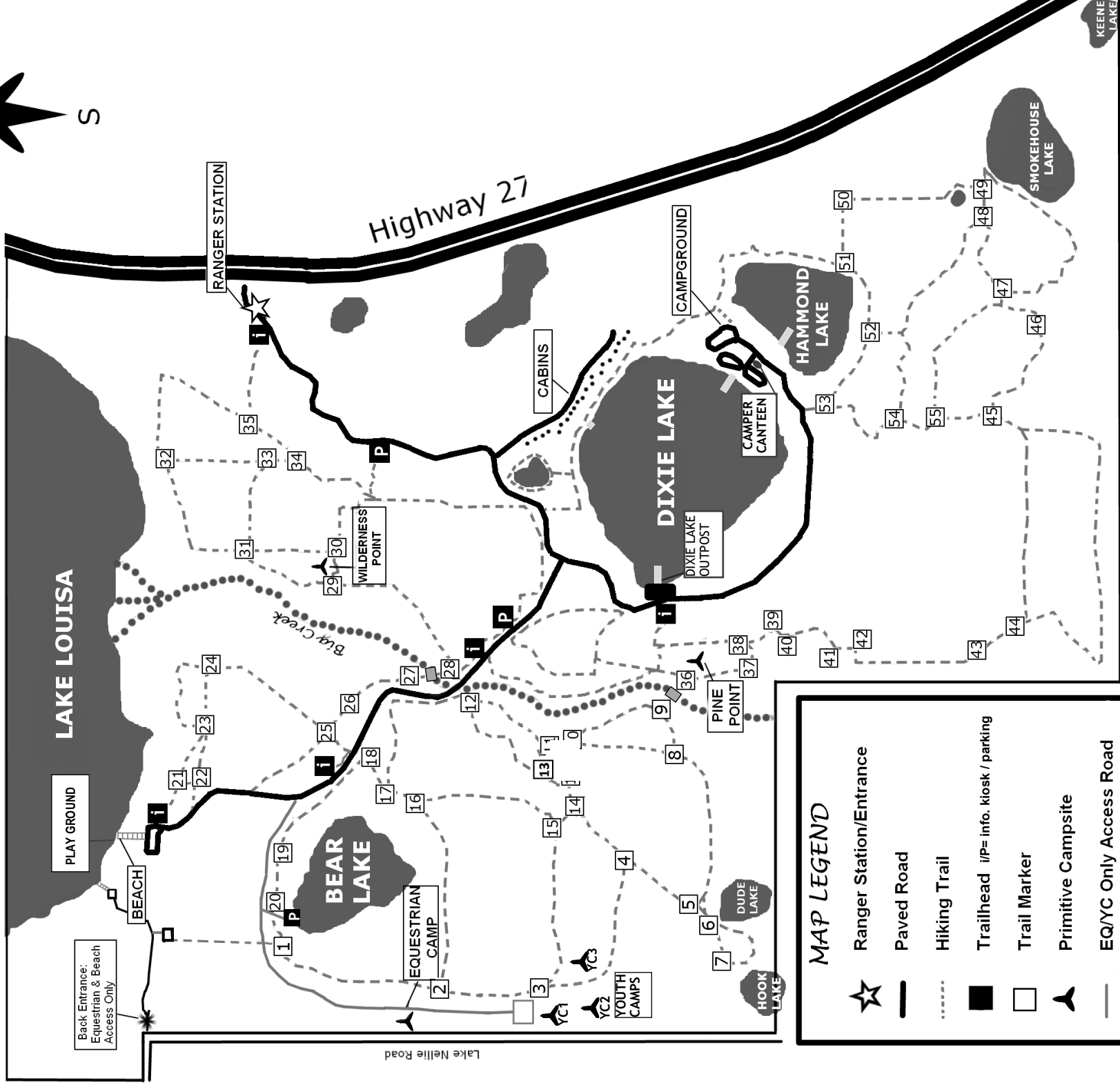
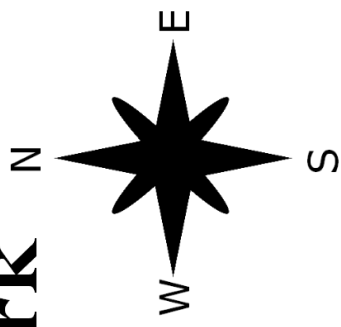


Lake Louisa State Park Trail Map

Please pay attention to trail blazes when hiking on trails. Main hiking trails are marked with orange single blazes. Side trails and loops are marked with blue single blazes. Double blazes indicate a significant change in direction. If the top blaze is offset from the bottom blaze, the turn is in the direction of the top blaze.

Some trails intersect with service roads that are not portrayed on this map. For safety, pay close attention to trail markers while hiking and stay on marked trails.

TRAIL DISTANCES:

Nature Trail: (#21, 23-29, 31-35)	3.5 miles
Big Creek Loop: (#28-30)	2.0 miles
Equestrian/Bronson Loop: (#1-20)	5.5 miles
Bear Lake Loop: (#1-2, 16-20)	2.0 miles
Compton's Loop: (#10-13)	1.0 miles
Dude's Loop: (#5-7)	0.5 miles
Sandhill Loop: (#36, going North)	1.5 miles
South Trail: (#36-44)	1.2 miles
South Loop: (#45-55)	2.5 miles



PRIMITIVE CAMPING

- Fee is \$5.55 per person per night. Primitive camping does not include campground facilities like bathrooms or showers. Reservations can be made by calling the Ranger Station.
- Check-in is after 3:00 P.M. For safety reasons, the latest you can check in is one hour prior to sunset. Check-out is before 1:00 P.M.
- Trailhead parking lots are identified on the map provided. Please be sure to have your camper registration slip made visible on your vehicle on the front windshield, for park staff to see.
- All fires must be contained within the fire ring. Please be sure the fire is out cold before going to sleep or leaving the site.
- For nature's sake, collecting downed wood or cutting of live trees is not allowed. Firewood can be purchased at Camper Canteen (limited hours)
- Please do not tie anything to the trees. This will damage the trees' outer layer which could impact the trees' health.
- We ask you to please carry any trash you bring with you out.

EQUESTRIAN CAMPING

- The camping fee is \$5.55 per person per night. 6 paddocks (each with 2 stalls) can be reserved. Each paddock has a picnic table and a fire ring. 5, of 6, paddocks have non-potable water for horse use only. For more information, events, and paddock reservations, please call the Ranger Station.
- Equestrian area includes the Hitching Post (P3 guided trail rides available by reservations only), event field, day use visitor area with a pavilion and self-composting toilet, equestrian primitive camping paddocks and tie up posts.
- For everyone's safety, please do not cross the paved road with horses. All trails are multi-use and designed for two way traffic, please be courteous of other trail users.



HIKING & BIKING

- The numbers, along the trail, at each intersection indicate your location according to the map. For safety reasons, please stay on marked trails.
- The main hiking trail is orange blazed and 3.5 miles, whereas spur trails or loops are blue blazed. See trail map for other trail distances.
- Please report unsafe conditions to park staff.

Park Policies and Safety Guidelines

- Park rules 62D-2 F.A.C. are enforced, e.g. alcohol and fireworks are prohibited.
- Pets are welcome in the Park, but must be well behaved and on a 6 ft. handheld leash at all times. Some restrictions do apply.
- Areas of the trails may contain hazards or fragile members of our unique ecosystems. Please stay on marked trails.
- Save wildlife by using caution and watching your speed at all times.
- The park is open from 8:00 A.M. until sunset, daily. Lake access by boat and trails close one hour prior to sunset/closing.
- Park Service is committed to provide accessibility to all visitors, including those with disabilities. A complete copy of the Accessibility and Inclusion Policy is available at the Ranger Station.

Remember to bring plenty of drinking water with you, since neither trails nor primitive campsites have potable water available.
