Great Blue Heron (Areda herodias)

Instant ID

- A gray wading bird standing up to 54 inches tall with a 72 inch wingspan
- Has a long neck with light gray feathers and is often held in an "S" shape
- Legs are long and dark gray
- Back is gray with wingtips which are darker
- Wispy feathers cover the back and base of neck
- · A black plume begins on and extends past the head
- Has rust-colored patches on the tops of its legs and shoulders

Native Niches

 Frequents coastlines and waterways throughout most of North America and small portions of northern South America

Favorite Foods

Eats fish, frogs, snakes and any other animal in or around water

Critter Characteristics

- Two races are the white-headed Würdemann's heron which is unique to southern Florida and the all white great white heron which is common to the Caribbean and parts of south Florida
- · Will hold out wings to create shade and lure prey to swim closer

Population Protection

- Like many wading birds it was once widely hunted for the feather trade
- The Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918 provides protection to all native and migratory birds in the United States
